#### **Minutes**

#### Treasurer's Report

The balance in the checking account as of June 30, 2023 was \$42,281.58. Cathy P. moved to approve the treasurer's report, and Gary Sweet seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Old Business**

There are currently 122 members and six applicants waiting for approval. If a member knows of someone interested in joining that person will have to get on the waiting list.

Elections will be held next month and there has been no one volunteering for commodore position, so consider getting involved by volunteering.

The Chuck Wentz Fishing Derby will be held July 15 with signups beginning at 7am. One fish per contestant with only trout qualifying for prizes. No walleye or lake trout will be accepted. Winners will be determined by weight, and fish must be weighed by 3pm. There will be a fish fry starting at 5pm sponsored by the Feketis, Selks and Browns. Bring an appetizer, side dish or dessert to share.

There has been an ongoing discussion on speed bumps with no decision on resolution. A larger sign with the 10 miles per hour will be erected.

#### **New Business**

No date has been set for the annual State Inspection so there is still time to make any corrections needed on your lot.

Perry mentioned that non members are using the Club's docks and was wondering if that could somehow be prevented. There was also a parking issue when a wedding was being held at the Club.
